## **PROTOCOLS FOR BLOCK PLAY 2023**

Block play is multi-week 'league' play in different formats. The number of blocks (usually 1-3) and number of games per round depends on the number of players that register. Signing up for block play is a commitment to play the first round between **May 26 and July 9** and the second round between **July 17 and August 23**.

All players play in the first round and then are sorted for the second round into Championship Flight and A/B Flights based on each players win-loss record. Semi-finals are held on **August 24 and 25**. While semi-final games can be played before or after the scheduled dates, finals for all blocks are held on **September 2 and 3** only. (The schedule is subject to change.)

The number of wins determines finishing standings in block play. If there is a tie, it will be resolved by number of wins, then head-tohead, then net hoops, then closest to the peg.

Games are arranged between players. Players are equally responsible to complete games by the scheduled dates. Scores are kept by players on sheets posted in the Clubhouse. Scores for the Bayfield Cup must include the date the game is played for submission to the World Croquet Ranking database.
